Over the Easter break two of our parents, Pierre Charles Wood (Henry Year 3, George Reception) and Iain Robinson (Oliver Year 1), successfully took on the challenge of running 250 km across the Sahara desert in Morocco. Needing to be self sufficient, carrying their equipment and food for the week and living off rationed water in temperatures exceeding 50 degrees they both did brilliantly with Iain finishing 27th and Pierre 323rd out of 1,200 competitors. They spent the afternoon at Hall Grove this week sharing their experience with the boys and girls who have been inspired to take on their own adventures by the stories they told and the replica camp they built in the New Hall!

## Information from Surrey Safeguarding Children Board

The Education Safeguarding Team have received notification of two apps that have been highlighted as a concern by Surrey Police. The first is called 'Monkey'. Users are connected at random to engage in a 10 second live video chat. They can add more time or add the person to Snapchat to continue the connection. The content of the videos can be explicit or abusive and children and young people are vulnerable to exploitation through the opportunity for private chat with people they do not know.

It is a dating app which contains a section for 13-17 years olds, but there are no age verification checks which means it is easy for adults to pose as children with the potential for grooming. Users who both 'like' each other can add each other on Snapchat allowing unregulated chat and imagery sharing. The NSPCC have published their own concerns about this app.

There are continued concerns regarding the 'Musical.ly' app which have been discussed at local Safeguarding meetings attended by our School Nurses.
