One of the last Jubilee projects of 2017 has been the replacement of the Athletics hut on the playing fields with a lovely new oak frame pavilion that has been erected this week. Later in the Autumn, we will plant some new trees close to the building; over the next 60 years they will grow in stature providing welcome shade for children and beneficial habitat for wildlife.

As we anticipate the start of Eco Week on Monday, we are also looking forward to our second Outdoor Learning Conference on Thursday and to the Country Fair on Friday. The latter will be visited by the Mayor of Surrey Heath and by no lesser figure than the Rt Hon Michael Gove, MP, Minister for the Environment and Rural Affairs.

Grandparents' Afternoon and Country Fair - Friday 20th October - 1330 to 1700

Grandparents are invited to arrive between 1330 and 1400. We suggest they begin with a tour of the school with their grandchildren so with this in mind, please make sure all grandparents know to go directly to their grandchild's classroom. Senior pupils will be on hand to point them in the right direction. Parking will be on the fields, and tea and coffee will be served in The Lighthouse from 1400.

The Year 8 children have been working hard on their Enterprise Scheme BEVAP (Business and Enterprise Visual Arts Project), creating exciting products in Art, DT, IT, Ceramics and Textiles.

Please bring lots of money to spend as we are raising funds for several charities including Christian Aid, The OSCAR Foundation, Sebastian's Action Trust, and Water Aid. As in previous years, there will be a good range of produce and products to buy, including fresh meat from South Battisborough Farm, local honey, home-made chutneys, flowers, outdoor sculptures and many other products for the home and garden. There will be plenty of wildlife with the ever popular petting farm (sheep, ducks, goats etc.), a display of birds of prey and some stalls run by the children.

Important: all guests are reminded that this is an outdoor event. Whilst the forecast is currently good, in previous years we have been unfortunate enough to have experienced very poor weather. Please dress for the conditions (coats and boots may well be required) and be aware that access may be difficult across muddy fields.

The Fair closes at approximately 1700, but children are free to leave before that. They should 'sign out' with their class teachers once they are in the care of their guests or their parents.
